## WEEKLY MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

How often you've heard me say that so many of us are selective in what we hear. We have difficulty in listening to what is being said. 'Michael should talk less and listen more . . ."

If we are honest, a comment about our poor listening skills would be found in many school reports throughout the land. What is of importance is the Message not the Messager.

Today's Gospel talks about the Messenger, John the Baptist who was bringing a Message to the people of his time but sadly they did not wish to listen to his words. Every message is of importance, beneficial to those who listen and the voice of John the Baptist travels through time to the people of our day:

"This is the man who the prophet Isaiah spoke about,

'A voice cries in the wilderness , Prepare a way for the Lord ,

Make His paths straight . . . ' "

John is not a "Messenger of doom and gloom" but of change and direction, one of Repentance, turning back to Christ and His Church but also for the Church to Repent , and refocus on the simple words of the Prophet John . The institutional Church should be a voice of Hope, Assurance and understanding .

The Church has become a voice speaking to humanity: for as John was a prophet in his time so is the church to the people of today and the future. Maybe one reason why people are not listening to the voice of Christ within the Church is because of its attitude towards the People of God, not living as the Jesus of the Beatitudes has taught us with Noble Simplicity and Service but has become one of Power, and Dominance.

The Prophet Isaiah paints a wonderful picture with words in our first reading, if only we would listen and take heed, the World and Ourselves would change for the better . . .

"Strengthen all weary hands, Steady all trembling knees,

Say to your weary self Courage do not be afraid, look your God is coming, he is coming to save us.

He does not judge by appearances but judges with love and integrity.

The wolf will live with the lamb, calf and lion will live together, they will do no hurt, no harm shall come their way. For those who listen shall live on my Holy Mountain,

for this is a New Country filled with the knowledge and love of God and Neighbour. . ."

So let us not be distracted, but listen to the voice of the Prophet to Repent and come to the Mountain of the Living God.
