WEEKLY MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

. Some of you will remember that one day as I was returning from my daily walk via Grange Gardens I was stopped by a lady who had a complaint. She thought I was the Park Keeper. I explained that the last Park Keeper to work and care for the gardens left many years ago. Maybe it was the flower-pot that I had under my arm that gave her the impression I was a man of importance!

I hope you all had a good week and were not soaked from the unpredictable downpours to say nothing of the icy blasts that have descended upon us.

I remembered writing a few words during Lent a few years ago saying that all of us were going into the wilderness during the lockdown that we had, making the journey into the Desert a reality.

This weekend we start the journey of Advent: a time of preparation, of going out again into the Desert of oneself.

These next few weeks of preparation, not for Santa, but for Jesus, Mary and Joseph, need to have a definite focus. Let us heed the importance of the words of John the Baptist calling us to prepare for the coming of the Lord, stripping away all that hinders us from this encounter.

The starkness of the stable gives way to the Brightness and Glory of the Christ Child, as will our Church and our lives.

You will see that the stable has been put up in readiness for those who are journeying to Bethlehem, for those who sought the first glimpse of the Infant King. The Silence of the First Christmas will be broken by the sound of the angels.
