**SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION 2021 : RECONCILIATION AND HOLY COMMUNION**

Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion continues to be parish based. Parents of Baptised children in Y3 and above who wish their child to receive these sacraments need to be attending Mass on a regular basis with their child/ children. Parents can register their child by speaking with one of the Catechists (Mary Taylor, Renata Harmsworth, Christine German) or Canon Mike before or after weekend Masses.

Arrangements for those children currently in Y3 will be made in the new year. Families will need to be attending Mass regularly. Again, if you wish to enrol your child to be prepared for these important Sacraments, please speak with one of the Catechists or Canon Mike . Thank You.

### **MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE**

During my time in Rome, there were eight students from Wales: six for the Archdiocese of Cardiff and two for Menevia and three students at the Venerable English College. Each year we would meet for Mass and a meal to celebrate the Feast of the Saints of Wales. This was an important event and it strengthened our identity in our Faith, the Faith of Our Fathers and was an opportunity for us to share a glass of wine and encourage each other to return to our homeland and as St David said

“ Be joyful in spreading the Faith”

When we talk about Saints of Wales, many of today's Welsh men or women stare into the distance, not being able to name one, let alone five. Illtyd, Dyfrig, David, Non, and Teilo. , these five lived, worked and died within Wales during what is known as the 'Dark Ages'.

The Romans left Wales after hundreds of years, having brought with them Peace, Roads, Cities and Wine! Sadly when they left, these lands went into a state of 'darkness'. Yet little 'tea lights' of hope faith and endurance could be found with the preaching of these Saints. They kept the Faith alive struggling through adversary and danger.

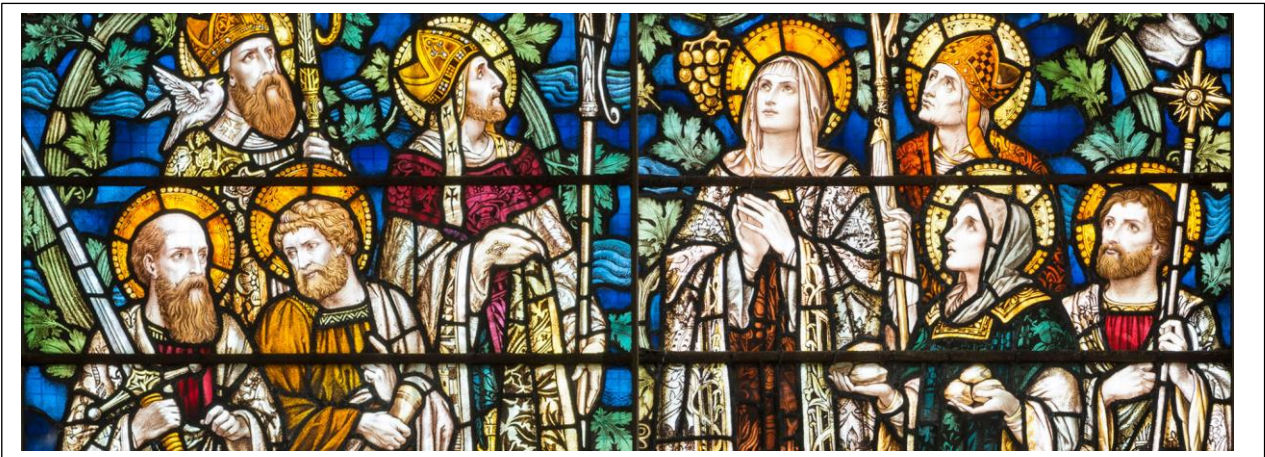
As we move to the present day if we head to the Arms Park, the day of the next International and ask people about our Countrymen, what would they reply?
