

WEEKLY MESSAGE

Once there was a man, who had a small bowl which was very precious to him. One day he dropped the bowl and it smashed into several pieces. As he looked at the damage, he considered what to do next. He decided to try to repair the bowl. Carefully he glued the pieces back in place until the bowl was whole again. Then, he decided to use the Japanese art of Kintsugi: covering all the broken and damaged scars of the break with gold. When he had finished, the bowl looked even more beautiful that it was before. Visitors said they did not recognise it as the same bowl, even though they knew it was.

Religious scholars have often puzzled over the fact that Mary and the disciples did not recognise Jesus when they saw Him after the Resurrection. Though He was the same Jesus that they knew, He looked more beautiful, more radiant. The man they knew as Jesus was now changed, was transformed and their minds and eyes were not prepared for this. His wounds and scars of suffering were now made beautiful.

Sometimes when Jesus comes into our lives, we do not recognise Him. When we pray for something we expect to be answered in a certain way, a way of our choosing. The Lord does not work that way. If we were amongst the disciples after the Resurrection, would we be like Thomas, unbelieving and wanting proof. Or would we be open to the presence of the Lord as He talks quietly to us, guiding us and showing us His beauty.

No one can explain the Resurrection of the Lord, even though many scientists have tried. We just know that it happened, and because it happened, our Faith came into being. Our Faith in the Lord has grown and grown spreading to almost every corner of our world. Our Faith is the beautiful scars of the suffering of the Lord. His hands which once healed the sick and blest children, the hands which helped Joseph make things of wood, the hands which were joined to the wood on the cross, those hands reach out to us every day. May we stretch out our hands and hold those beautiful hands in ours as we recognise Our Lord and Our God.


