WEEKLY MESSAGE

There comes a point in everyone's life when you have to place your trust in someone else. When we were children we trusted that the adults around us would keep us safe from harm and a look after our best interests. As adults we like to be in control, to decide for ourselves which path to take, what to do. So it is hard for us to relinquish that control and place it in the hands of others.

This week I have had to do just that... to place my sight in the hands of the surgeons, who will hopefully enable me to see more clearly.

I know that I have to be patient, and give my eyes chance to heal. Again, we are not a patient people. In our world today everything is instant..... now. We hope and expect things to happen immediately. A quick answer to a text, the phone is answered straight away, the gas man to arrive at the appointed time.

When we pray, we expect God to answer immediately and make whatever we pray for to come right. But God does not work that way. He wants us to place all our trust in Him. Our time frame is not God's time frame. He will always answer, but maybe not in the way we expect.

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. Psalm 56:3

This week I ask the Lord for patience and the strength to place my trust in Him. Whatever way He answers my prayer, I pray that I may follow the path that He shows me.

*Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God;
I will strengthen you, I will help you,
I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. Isaiah 41:10*
