WEEKLY MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

How often have you heard me say that we are very selective in what we hear. Over the Christmas period a verbal invitation has been given to the whole world as well as here in Grangetown to "Come to the Manger": an invitation given by the Angels to visit and encounter the Infant Jesus. Sadly for many, Christmas and New Year is a time for shopping, parties and of food and this invitation to celebrate the birth of Our Lord has become lost in all the noise. Even if you missed that invitation it's never too late to come home to the "House of Welcome"

Giving gifts when you visit someone is very customary so... 'What gift can we bring when we visit Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the Holy Family?' The greatest give you can offer is yourself. With true Humility we can offer Him our lives in service for all those we encounter on our journey of life. As Jesus went on to say . . . ***"I came into the world to serve NOT to be served"***

During this week we hear how Mary and Joseph travelled to Jerusalem to present Jesus in the Temple. It was customary and the law that within 40 days after the birth of the firstborn son, the parents were to take the child to the Temple in Jerusalem and present him to the Lord. As soon as Mary was able to travel, she and Joseph set out for Jerusalem as the law required. It was a long journey for them, yet they wanted their newborn son to receive this sacred rite of purification. They knew the days ahead would be challenging but they put their faith in God knowing that He would always be at their side. We are all on a journey. If you imagine life as snakes and ladders, then there will be snake days and ladder days, good days and not so good days that are filled with challenges and trails.

On Thursday we start a New Year, the start of an adventure, a journey of discovery, not knowing what lies ahead of us. For many of us, there is fear of the future because of the past. Sometimes we carry burdens of the mistakes made during the past year, which hinder us from moving forward. LET THEM GO! Hand them over to the Lord, for this is a time of opportunity of renewal and regeneration.

I wish to end with the words of the Queen's father, George VI. The World was over-run with the start of the Second World War. No hope or future, a war that brought misery and despair. So on the eve of 1940 he spoke these words trying to inspire and energise a fearful and depressed nation.

"We shall remain undaunted in the face of war. I said to the Man who stood at the Gate of the New Year

"Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown" and he replied

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be better than light, and safer than a known way"
