WEEKLY MESSAGE

Not many weeks ago 18 of our young people received the Sacrament of Confirmation and during their preparation sessions they learned about the symbols of the Holy Spirit. One of these symbols is that of fire. John the Baptist said that he was Baptising with water but the One who was coming (Jesus) will baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire. You may also recall that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles like 'tongues of fire'.

What does fire do? Just recently we have heard of the wild fires in Europe, destroying everything in their path. Fire can also be used to purify and cleanse of impurities. So why does Jesus talk about bringing fire to the earth? He is speaking about the division and conflict that his arrival will bring, not as a desire for conflict, but as a consequence of his message and mission. He uses the imagery of fire to represent the intensity and transformative power of his message, and the division to illustrate the choices people will make between following him or not.

In today's world, every day we see and hear multiple stories of division and violence: in families, cities and countries. Perhaps the most frightening stories are the acts of violence and destruction that take place in our own cities, our own neighbourhoods and perhaps within our own families.

Jesus wants to motivate us to live peacefully, lovingly, cooperatively and respectfully with each and every person on earth, even the individuals we may not like or agree with. He wants to awaken us to another way to live. He wants the Holy Spirit to cleanse, purify and change our selfish perspective on life, so that the fire of His love burns through us every day.
