<u>NEW POPE:</u>. This Sunday 18 May, Pope Leo XIV will be formally installed in St Peter's Square with a Mass for the beginning of his pontificate. The papal inauguration now involves the formal bestowal of the pallium, a white woollen band adorned with crosses that's worn with the papal vestments — a symbol of the pope's universal jurisdiction. He will also be presented with the Fisherman's Ring that has been specially cast for him.

MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY: This Sunday we will have the Crowning of Our Lady's Statue. Hopefully before each of the weekday Masses we will say the Rosary.

<u>FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION MASSES</u>: Thank you to all who attended the last two Sunday Masses when we celebrated with several of our young people as they took the next steps on their Faith Journey. Please remember them in your prayers and ask the Holy Spirit to guide them on the right path.

TRAINING FOR NEW PRIESTS: Last weekend we had a retiring collection to support the training costs of new priests. However, many people said they had forgotten so we are going to have another go. Priests are called to live simple lives, yet high-quality training comes at a significant cost. On average, the Archdiocese of Cardiff-Menevia invests £189,000 (2019 figure) in the formation of each seminarian over seven years. However, following ordination, a priest may offer over 40 or 50 years of dedicated service, making this investment profoundly worthwhile. Please donate and if you can Gift Aid your donation that would be good. The 'buckets' will be out this weekend and next weekend.

WEEKLY MESSAGE

In his first address Pope Leo XIV, who is fluent in multiple languages, including Spanish, Italian, French and Portuguese, expressed a desire for a Church that is 'engaged with the modern world and always looking for peace, charity and being close to people, especially those who are suffering.'

This Sunday at 10.00am in Rome, he will be formally installed as our new Pope. He will receive the Papal Pallium, and the Fisherman's Ring. This ring, also known as the Piscatory Ring, is a gold signet ring symbolizing his role as the successor of St. Peter, a fisherman. It was traditionally used to seal official documents, but now serves as a symbolic emblem of papal authority and is worn on the right hand.

This Sunday Jesus says to us that we are "To love one another as I have loved you" Loving each other is not always easy to do. An American journalist, after watching Mother Teresa caring for a man with gangrene, remarked to her: 'I wouldn't do that for a million dollars.' Mother Teresa replied: 'Neither would I... but I do it for love of God.' Selfishness keeps us shut in, builds barriers, even walls, between us and others. What frees us is caring for others, being friends, being sisters and brothers to them, being good neighbours. A doctor, who has shared some of the deepest moments in the lives of many patients, says that people facing death don't think about the degrees they've earned, the positions they've held, or how much wealth they've amassed. What really matters at the end is whom you have loved and who has loved you.

Love asks the best from us, and brings out the best in us. Being loved gives us a surprising energy and courage. Love makes us fruitful, productive, strong and constant in doing good. Elizabeth Kubler-Ross wrote 'Love is the flame that warms our soul, energises our spirit and supplies passion to our lives. It's our connection to God and to one another.' This is the message of Jesus. "Love one another as I have loved you"
