CONGRATULATIONS: We celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth Il. She is the longest reigning Monarch that the Britain has ever had. ## MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

During the past week many of us celebrated two people who in their own way have shown us how to serve their neighbour with Simple Humility, Pope John Paul and Queen Elizabeth.

Many Catholics remember the visit of the Pope to these shores and in particular to Cardiff in June 1982. He came as a 'Shepherd', to feed, heal and encourage "Peter do you love me? 'Yes Lord you know I love you' Then Feed My Sheep"

The whole of his Pontificate was one of Serving the People of God, travelling the world assuring all People that they were loved and had a special relationship with an "Understanding Father'. The Pope came to Cardiff to "Feed" us with God's word and the Eucharist fulfilling his Master's wishes "feed My lambs". He became the "Servant of the Servants of God" in sickness and in health leading by example.

The second person we celebrated this past week was the Queen who again in sickness and in health showed what it means to Serve . She undertook vows at her Coronation when she was anointed with Holy Oil and promised to God she would dedicate her life to Serve . She has done this for 70yrs leading from the front in good and bad times .

Maybe we can thank God for these two role models, standard bearers of Service inspired by the example of Christ and filled with the Power of the Holy Spirit .

This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates the Feast of Pentecost , the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Birth of the Church , the Body of Christ inspired by the Spirit . The Queen and Pope John Paul could not have carried out their Master's wishes unless they were filled with the Holy Spirit . It's the same with you and me. Unless we carry within our very selves God's Spirit we cannot fulfil our Christian calling to serve. We, like the Pope and the Queen have been anointed and commissioned to serve one's neighbour . The people in the Upper Room were a rag bag of frightened selfish individuals unable and unwilling to help those around them in Jerusalem . It's the same with us, a rag bag of selfish, frightened individuals shirking our responsibility to those around us. You will find in another part of this weeks newsletter an appeal asking for Volunteers to help run this parish of St Pat's.

Many of us like the first Apostles afraid of commitment to service . They entered the Upper Room full of fear, but after receiving God's Spirit left the room unafraid , full of confidence and belief brimming with self assurance Ready Willing and Able to commit their future to the building up of God's Kingdom here on Earth .
