WEEKLY MESSAGE

Once there was a man, who had a small bowl which was very precious to him. One day he dropped the bowl and it smashed into several pieces. As he looked at the damage , he considered what to do next. He decided to try to repair the bowl. Carefully he glued the pieces back in place until the bowl was whole again. Then, he decided to use the Japanese art of Kintsugi: covering all the broken and damaged scars of the break with gold. When he had finished, the bowl looked even more beautiful that it was before. Visitors said they did not recognise it as the same bowl, even though they knew it was. Religious scholars have often puzzled over the fact that Mary and the disciples did not recognise Jesus when they saw Him after the Resurrection. Though He was the same Jesus that they knew, He looked more beautiful, more radiant. The man they knew as Jesus was now changed, was transformed, and their minds and eyes were not prepared for this. His wounds and scars of suffering were now made beautiful.

Sometimes when Jesus comes into our lives, we do not recognise Him. But He is always with us and today, we can go from here, nourished, strengthened and fed. Fed at the Table of plenty - where God provides for all who believe. - Here, at the Table of plenty. That is what we believe.

Today for the First time the boys and girls, your sons and daughters, will meet Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist. They have been preparing for a long time, in fact since they day they were baptised. But in recent months they have met together, prayed together, worked together, walked together as they have come to learn about the Lord Jesus. It will be an encounter with the Lord. The Lord who loves them. The Lord who has a job for them to do: to spread the Good News. When they receive the Lord in the Eucharist, when they receive Him in Holy Communion, when they hear the words "The Body of Christ", they receive Jesus, Jesus truly present, Jesus here with us.

And how do we know this? Because Jesus told us Himself. At the Last Supper with His Apostles, He gave them this instruction, *"Take this and eat it, for this is my body. Do this in memory of me"*

Dear Parents please encourage your children in their faith, don't let their First Communion be their last. Make it your task to help your Sons and Daughters to grow in the practice of their faith, bring them to Mass, join with them, and most of all encourage them. Help them to appreciate this wonderful gift they have received, the Gift of Faith. Trust in God.
