

## MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

Often, there are things people consider of great value but in the eyes of the world are valueless. Objects like the pencil I bought my mother during my time in Primary School on a trip to Barry Island, or the paper Father Christmas my sister made and brought out each year..... in the eyes of our parents, things 'OF GREAT VALUE' Priceless!

I thought of another gift, this time given to each baptised Catholic. For some it's 'brought out' each week, for others they hold it once, its relevance forgotten, Christ in the Eucharist, Holy Communion.

A couple of weeks ago we remembered John Paul's visit to the People of Wales, where we celebrated Mass and there were a number of children who made their First Holy Communion.

"You are the Church of Today and the Hope of Tomorrow"

This great gift was given to us by the Lord Himself. "Take and eat, Take and drink, Do this in memory of Me"

For many years I've said "This is your First, and I hope not your last Holy Communion."

Of the thousands within our parish of St Patrick's who think this gift of Christ's Body and Blood is valueless, I must ask the question 'Why?' If my mother kept the pencil as an outward sign of my love for her, why can't we see that Holy Communion is the Lord's outward sign of His love for us.

Today's Mass is a reminder of the great Feast of Corpus Christi. Many Catholics have lost this love of Christ in the Eucharist and 1'm concerned they don't fully understand who they are holding in the palm of their hands.

## "My Lord and My God"

Young and old, practicing and non-practicing, have an open invitation to come into the presence of Jesus, the humble one, the suffering servant.

"Come as you are, that's how I want you. Close to my heart, loved and forgiven, Come as you are, that's how I love you.

Come as you are, feel quite at home. Come as you are, why stand alone? Come as you are, trust me again.

Nothing can change the love that I bear you And all will be well, just come as you are."

Let us pray as a family of God we will re-kindle this love of Jesus in the Eucharist by seeing this great gift as beneficial to the Church and the world.
