

THE NEW LECTIONARY The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use the English Standard Version – Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. We will start using this new Lectionary on the First Sunday of Advent 2024.



WEEKLY MESSAGE

Some weeks ago we heard of the Jewish reaction to Jesus as the Son of God. He did not fit their idea of what a Messiah should be. They were maybe expecting the Messiah to have a 'cosmic' army to free them from the sway of the Romans, and Jesus was not this at all. His message was one of peace, love and trust. He tried to explain to them that He had come to fulfil all the prophesies of old and that He was the Way, the Truth and the Life. However, many were so entrenched in their own beliefs that they found it hard to change their ways, and many responded with anger and rage.

Sadly human beings as a species have a tendency to rise to anger, and simmering below the surface of all of us is the 'red mist' waiting for an opportunity to show itself when things don't go our way. The angry extreme actions of an individual can have devastating consequences, but the calculated actions of some to promote chain reactions of anger in others are even worse. We have all seen the news in the past week and how so many people have become caught up in outbursts of uncontrolled anger and violence. This is not the Way that Jesus came to show us. No figure in history has been so widely portrayed in film, in drama, in story, in books, in narrative ,as Jesus. But hearing about Him is not enough. There must be an inner opening of the eyes and the ears of the soul, so that we begin to understand the implications of His life and His message. That is what our Lord is talking about. We need to have our ears opened so that the full meaning of what He did and said becomes evident to us, and we personally see that it involves us on a very personal level. There will be times when we are challenged, when we face others who have different opinions, when we feel we are at a disadvantage, when we feel cross and feelings run high. This is a time when we need to enlist the help of the Lord, to steer us away from retaliation and anger and to find another way.... the Lord's way. These last weeks we have been hearing about how Jesus is the 'living bread come down to save us' This partaking of Jesus in Holy Communion will give us the spiritual strength to seek Him, and to find another way. Because He is The only Way, the Truth and the Life.

Let us pray that those who seek violence and anger will turn away from this course of action and seek the way of peace.
