### **MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE**

I've said and done silly things during my life, both as a Priest and on the other side of the Altar rails. One thing I've never tried is 'drugs'. I suppose the people who became my friends were like me, liked a good drink, but never succumbed to the temptation of the 'wacky baccy' or 'pill popping'. Over the years I have met many who became addicted and said they had seen and talked with 'visions'.

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, followed by the feast of the Guardian Angels. I've never seen my Guardian Angel, let alone the Archangel Michael, Gabriel or Raphael. These celestial beings were often sent by God as messengers; bringing God's message to a World unwilling not only to hear the message but to believe in the existence of Angels.

We read in this weekend's Gospel, the words of Jesus, sent as a messenger from the Father:

***"When you give a cup of water in my name, you'll not lose your reward...."***

How lucky we are that within this Parish and the Community of Grangetown there are those willing to care for the vulnerable. We saw this during the 'lockdown', people with Faith as well as those who do not believe in God, going that extra mile. Modern day 'Angels', Messengers of Hope and Charity.

One Saint who was truly a Messenger of Hope and Charity was Vincent de Paul: a 17<sup>th</sup> Century French Priest who dedicated his whole life in the service of his neighbour. Within St Patrick's we have a group of 'Angels' who come together as the SVP ( Saint Vincent de Paul Society)

As the words of Jesus speak to us, the SVP puts these words into practice. As the First World War Poster said:

***"Your Country Needs You !"***

Well, this Parish, this Community, the SVP needs YOU to share the Cup of Water.

***"The Harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few,"***

So come and be an 'Angel', earn your wings and wear them with pride. Don't wait till you die to meet Michael, Gabriel and Raphael face to face. Make them real to the less fortunate here in Cardiff.

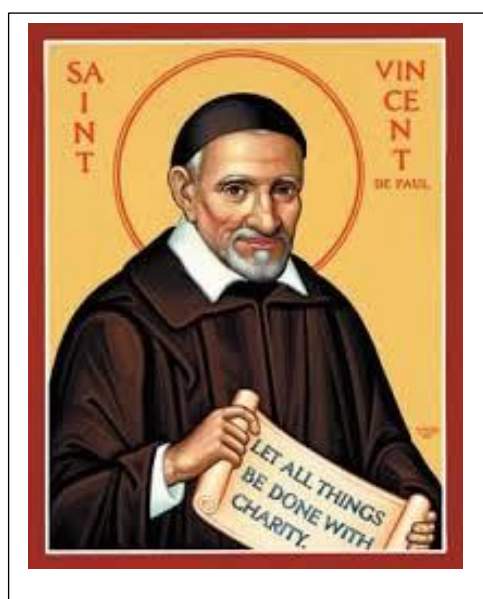
***" You are not dreaming, I'm no celestial being, I am Michael, a Grangetown Messenger of Hope and Charity"***
