

WEEKLY MESSAGE

All through our lives we experience changes. For some of us the first major change will be when we start school: making new friends, learning new things, a new environment, being influenced by someone other than family. Then as time goes on, more changes happen: some exciting like a wedding, some more demanding like moving home and some emotional like losing someone dear to us. The list is endless. The Church is no different. In the last two years we have experienced the death of one Pope, the election of another, the receiving of the new Lectionary, saying goodbye to loved ones and the welcoming of priests from overseas. For our young priests this was their first experience of living in the UK, away from family, friends and the country they knew, to embrace a new country which they hopefully now regard as their second home. St Patrick's parishioners have always welcomed new priests from whatever part of the world they come from and given them the support they need to enable them to fulfil their vocation. Over the next weeks Fr Valentine and Fr Peter will be packing their suitcases once more to move on to another flock, to share the Word of the Lord. For Fr Valentine it will be a chance to draw breath, hand over the reins of Parish Priest to Fr Peter who will be the Parish Priest of St Helen's Barry so that he can concentrate on his role as Prison Chaplain. Most of us don't know what this role as Chaplain entails, but suffice it to say that it is more demanding and exhausting than most of us could imagine. We thank them both for their time with us and we ask them to pack in their cases the good will and blessings from all of us in St Patrick's.

Some one else will be packing up for a move..... Canon Mike, who will be returning to us, with his myriad of boxes, (which seem to have travelled far and wide). He will be taking up residence as our Parish Priest once more.

Whatever the changes we experience in our lives, be it changing jobs, starting in a new class or school, moving home, the Lord is always with us... as we pack our bags, and face new challenges. He walks beside us every moment of every day, wanting to carry our burdens if we ask Him, to give us His Love which will sustain us in the days ahead. He will never intrude, but just wait, waiting for us to say, "Help me Lord. I cannot do these things without you"
