

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION DURING LENT:** As usual for those who wish to avail themselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), I will be available at the END of each weekend Mass NOT before Mass.

**ALL-DAY CONFESSIONS - THE CATHEDRAL.** On Saturday 9th April, the Saturday before Holy Week, St David's Cathedral will be open for the Sacrament of Reconciliation between 10.30am and 5.15pm. A team of priests from the Cardiff parishes and beyond will be available

**THE MASS OF CHRISM WITH THE BLESSING OF OILS** and the Renewal of Priestly Vows will take place at St. David's Cathedral on Tuesday 12 April 2022 at 11:30am.

**PALM SUNDAY:** Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and weather permitting the plan is that we will gather in the garden by the side of the Church and process through the main door into the Church. If you would prefer to wait in your pew for Mass to begin, then please do so. You can collect a palm from in the Porch.

**COVID RESTRICTIONS:** The wearing of Masks is now not compulsory. However, if you feel happier wearing a face covering, please continue to do so. Still in place: Sanitiser, no kneelers and taped off pews, 7 Day candles only.

Holy Communion is now in its rightful time in the Mass. Please come forward in TWO lines and return to your seats down the side aisle. (Kneelers are still not to be used to facilitate walking through the pews).

At the end of Mass, please use the nearest exit, either of the porches or the main door. For safety, use the grab handle as you go down the steps and please DO NOT stop to chat near the doors or the steps. There is plenty of room once you have cleared the exit.

Also we might have a hymn or two. **If you take a hymn book please return it to the bookcase by the main door OR leave it on the table by the porch door.** Masks to be worn whilst singing..... sorry. Please take a paper copy of the newsletter (if you can't access it online) as you come into Church.

**NEW COLLECTION BOXES:** The new boxes are available from this weekend. If you pay Income Tax, St Patrick's can collect Gift Aid with no cost to you at all. This is an extra 25p for every £1 you give. All you have to do is sign a consent form. Please consider this.

### **MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE**

Last weekend's Gospel was of the Prodigal Son: the Father seeking his lost Son, going in search of his child, the one who thought 'the grass was greener on the other side'. The child eventually came to realise that he had made a mistake and if you remember I told you on one occasion I 'did a runner' eventually finding I had made a mistake. The thrust of the story was the Father looking and eventually finding his child, not to chastise or reprimand, but to cry tears of joy and forgiveness " let us celebrate for my son has come back, he was lost but now he's been found"

The theme of Forgiveness is found again in this Sunday's Gospel. A lady of 'easy virtue' was caught and was to be stoned for her actions but would I be right in saying it takes TWO to commit adultery? It was and still is easy to condemn and in this case a WOMAN was condemned but what about the MAN, he seems to have walked away leaving his lady friend to 'face the music'?

It's so easy to condemn, to point the finger, but Christ embraced her, forgave and showed mercy and asks each of us to follow His example. He only made one comment " My friend I don't condemn you but go home and SIN NO MORE "

Five weeks ago on Ash Wednesday as the Ash was placed upon our heads the words were spoken "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" in other words SIN NO MORE !

What is important today and every day is the seeking out of the understanding, tolerant Lord, recognising one's own faults and not reviling our fellow pilgrim for stumbling. I stumble and fall like any person but like the lady, continually seek out the ear who will listen and a mouth that does not condemn but encourages.

This past week our young children encountered such a person in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) Explaining simply "DO NOT BE AFRAID" Why are you afraid to seek the Lord's Forgiveness? Why do so few within St Patrick's come to Confession? I'm there waiting for your call at the end of Mass each weekend to SIT, LISTEN, HEAL and FORGIVE.

So like 'my Lady Friend' have courage, be bold and undaunted and maybe then Lent will have been a positive experience.
