WEEKLY MESSAGE How time flies! we are in December and the really busy season is underway. The Advent calendars are out, the Christmas Card lists are being scrutinised, presents are being bought and menus for Christmas feasting are being made. Lots of plans. Last week we talked about re-connecting with others and with the Lord. In all the hurly-burly of the season, and the real reason for Christmas being pushed further and further into the background we might miss the chance to just sit and be still in the presence of the Lord, so don't miss the opportunity on Tuesday this week. Even if you can only give a short time, that time will be well spent. Advent is a time of preparation -- a time of waiting—and listening. Let's be fair we are not good at being patient and waiting or listening. We live in a world where everything is NOW! In the distant past God spoke to many people in the hope that they would listen and follow His path for living. Did they listen? -- not really. Moses, Isaiah, Jeremiah, in fact all the Old Testament Prophets tried to share God's Message but sadly it often fell on deaf ears. Many people heard the message, but did not take it to heart. That is why God decided to become a person, a real person, who would be born, who would live and who would share all the challenges, joys and woes of ordinary people so that He could deliver the Message Himself.

Advent is also a time for new thoughts, new beginnings, new projects, as we start a new year of Christian prayer and worship. The Gospel calls us to be ready to welcome Jesus as the anchor of our lives, our true Saviour, and prepare for His return at the end of time. It's an open invitation to make a new start in our own personal spiritual journeys.

It has been said that if we can learn in these weeks of Advent the importance of patient waiting we will have learned one of the greatest lessons in life. This is hard for us, especially in the West. We live in an instant age — instant food, instant this, that and the other. We are in a constant hurry. All around us are signs of hurrying, a sense of urgency, waiting is to be avoided at all costs. No time, no time. And yet that is what Advent is all about..... patiently waiting and preparing. But what of our preparing and getting ready to welcome the Christ Child into our lives?

Our challenge is to put Jesus at the centre of our day, in every task we do, in every journey we make. That is what God wants us to do. In short, God wants us to be happy and blessed and we become blessed when we choose the Way of the Lord. As we pass through life we are all being faced with a choice between two ways, either that of wrong doing, or, on the other hand, that of grace, which is allowing Jesus to be our guide and exemplar in all we do. How do we respond to this choice which is constantly before us? How will we put the whole reason for Christmas into the centre of our preparations? At the end of our life's journey how will we say we have prepared for the coming of Jesus? Have we given any time to welcome Him into our lives? Or have we just put Jesus near the bottom of a never-ending list?

Sometime today, find an extra 15 minutes of quiet time to just rest in God's presence. Don't speak. Just place yourself in God's care and let God touch your heart.

The candle of hope for the First Sunday of Advent assures us we can have hope that God will fulfil the prophecies declared in the Old Testament about Jesus.
