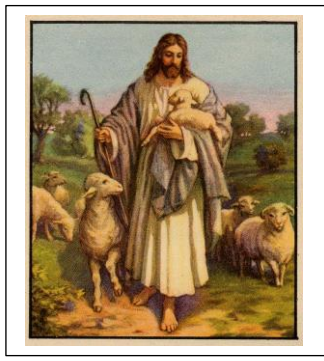

### **MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE**

As a young child in Neath, Ralph Fox, our neighbour, would take me to the cattle market to watch the farmers bring their animals to be sold. I can still see me in my mind's eye holding his hand, a little afraid of the cows and pigs and of course I still remember the great 'farm yard' smell! The only farming connection I have was that my mother was in the Land Army during the War.

A great deal of my Priestly Ministry was spent in the Valleys of South Wales, where you could open your door and there, wandering down the street would be a few sheep overturning dustbins looking for food with no shepherd in sight. Even today you still come across a dead sheep at the side of the road, having thought that the grass looked nicer on the other side, not knowing that a car was heading towards them sending them to a 'Sheepy Heaven!'

You could say that I've become a shepherd, not of sheep, but of souls, and the Church has become the field in which the sheep graze. But still, people wander away, some never to return, but others look for a way home, listening for the voice not of anger or rage but a voice of gentle compassion, sympathetic to their plight, willing to carry the distressed sheep rather than striking him with a stick.

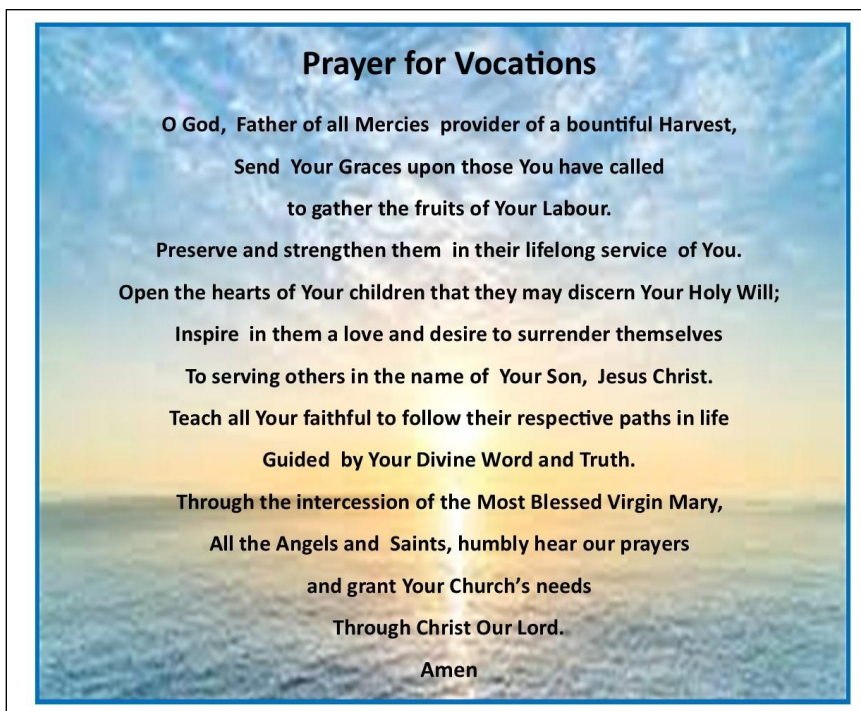
The role of the Priest is that of Christ the Good Shepherd. As we said last week, the number of clergy are getting older and fewer. This week maybe we should focus on the young clergy, those studying and those wrestling with God, calling them into the fields to care for the sheep. We need men to answer the call, so they will find God's people, who like the valley sheep, wander aimlessly looking for food and shelter.

As I write these few words there are three men offering to serve the Lord, within the Archdiocese of Cardiff: Gwyn Jones, Dale Cutlan and Elliot Hanson. I keep reminding you that there are more priests ready to retire or are long-term sick, than there are studying, so not only pray, but encourage. Priests come from families like yours, so without men coming forward,

more sheep will wander away, get lost and ignored, whilst others look to be fed and hear the Good News spoken by the shepherd of tomorrow.

In a few weeks time we will have a special collection to pay for the studies of those students. Roughly, each student costs the Diocese £190,000 over seven years.

I'm not sure what amount they paid the Beda College in Rome to keep me for four years ! Ha! Ha!
