WEEKLY MESSAGE

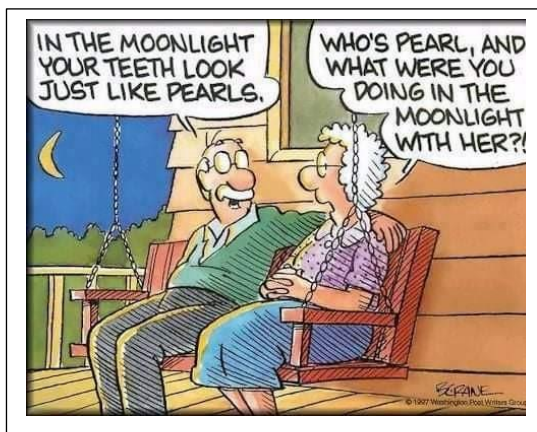
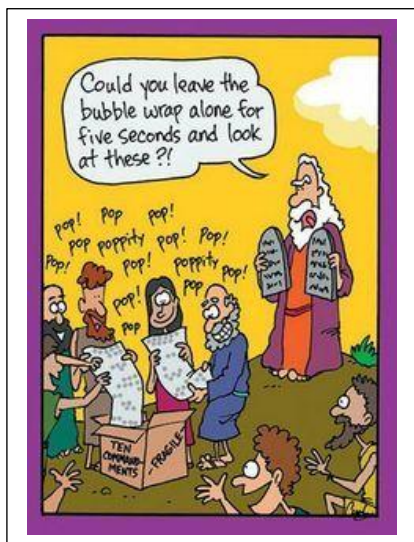
You have often heard me talk about the Brecon Beacon Mountain Rescuers who told me that in complete darkness a small lit tealight can be seen from a great distance away. Of course I didn't believe them so they took me out one night to prove it. As they left me in the darkness I became disoriented, confused, lost. Which way must I go? Then suddenly I saw a tiny light in the distance. Now I was faced with a choice: do I walk further into the darkness into oblivion or do I walk towards the light? Which would you choose?

In the reading from Isaiah today we hear that the people walked in great darkness and then in the Psalm we hear that Jesus is our Light and our Salvation. We all know about the importance of light: without it we would not be able to live. But Salvation? What does that mean? It means deliverance, being saved, being rescued. And that is why Jesus came to us: to rescue us and to show us the Way.

"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life . I am the Light of the World"

In the Gospel we hear how Jesus chose His helpers, ordinary fishermen. He simply asked them to Follow Him, to take a step and follow Him.

He says the same thing to us today, to follow Him, to leave our old way of thinking behind and follow Him on the path that He walks, which will lead us to Salvation. Each day brings a whole raft of challenges, and in some cases disappointments. But He will help us navigate the potholes of life and shine a light on future triumphs. If.... we trust Him and follow Him. He is the Light that shines in the darkness that will guide our steps.
