WEEKLY MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

**“Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest.
Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart;
and you will find rest for yourselves.
For my yoke is easy, and my burden light.”**

We all have difficult moments. The moments when we feel overwhelmed and burdened. What I call ‘Snake Days’ . It could be we are burdened by some tragedy in life, or it could be we are burdened by the small and monotonous aspects of life. We all have days when we think ‘where am I going?’ “What’s is all for?” Days when we make wrong choices and then suffer the consequences.

But whatever the case may be, Jesus wants us to hear and believe these words. “Come to me...” He says. Come to me no matter what is going on in your life. Come to me without hesitation and without fear.

Jesus also promises us that His “yoke is easy” and His “burden is light.” What does that mean? Does it mean that coming to Jesus will remove all hardship from our lives? No, not really. What it means is that coming to Jesus will enable us to endure and walk through any hardship we encounter.

We tend to think of ‘rest’ as sleeping, or just doing nothing. In fact rest is a time when we can experience the Lord if we open the door and let him in. In a world filled with noise, stress, and endless demands, Jesus offers a peace that cannot be found anywhere else. Rest-time is often not easy to achieve. But the Lord already knows what our troubles are, He is just waiting for an invitation. “Come to me, Come as you are.”
