WEEKLY MESSAGE

On Sunday a group of our young people will be Confirmed and will take responsibility for their faith and their relationship with God. Relationships are often complicated and sometimes we take people for granted. Our families provide everything we need when we are growing up: food, clothing, education, and advice. We just become used to them being there for us.

The same can be said about God in our lives. God is everywhere. He sees everything. He knows everything. He created us. We would have nothing, including our parents, unless God gave it to us. We have life through our parents...if you ask them on a good day they will admit that you were and are a miracle. But God ultimately is the origin of all life, our life. So how do we respond? Often we begrudge Him an hour of our time on Sunday. We say a quick prayer before an exam or a football game, or when we are having relationship problems, or when we need a favour. How often do life's demands get in the way of knowing God better. Sports, clubs, homework, our friends, fun – all this consumes our time.

Then who has time for God? All the while God waits. But He doesn't wait outside. He waits within. He is present. He loves us, and like a parent whose son or daughter never says "thank you," He patiently waits for us to think of Him. In today's Gospel we hear how the Lord is the Good Shepherd who looks after his sheep. Anyone who knows anything about sheep know they are prone to one moment be following the flock and the next wandering off getting into all manner of difficulties. And God knows it all. At times we are just like sheep and we drift away not realising that we have strayed far from the path God wants us to follow. On Thursday we learned that the Holy Spirit guided the Cardinals in their choice of a new Shepherd to guide His Church. We thank God for those whose ears are open to the calling of our God within and we pray for our young people who this weekend will receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Let us pray too for ourselves, that we may respond to the calling of the Lord as He gathers us up into the safety of His sheepfold.

Holy Spirit of fire, flame everlasting, so bright and clear, speak this day in our hearts. Lighten our darkness and purge us of fear,

Holy Spirit of fire. The wind can blow or be still, or water be parched by the sun. A fire can die into dust: but here the eternal Spirit of God tells us a new world's begun.

Holy Spirit of love, strong are the faithful who trust in Your power.

Love Who conquers our will, teach us the words of the gospel of peace, Holy Spirit of love.
