By withholding our gifts, the Lord is saddened by our selfish attitude.

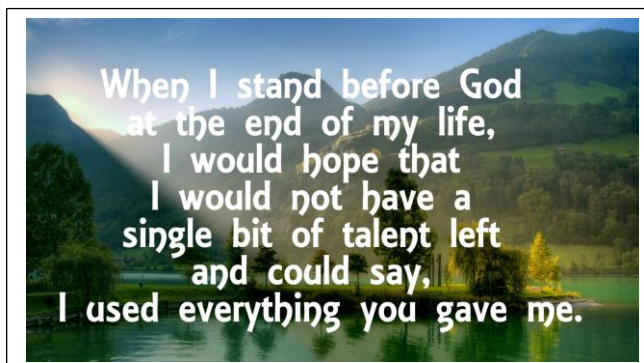
"The man who received five talents , made five more. The same with the two talents. But the man with one talent dug a hole and hid it. "
