MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

Speaking to the American People in 1932, President Roosevelt said, “ The only thing we have to fear, is ‘fear’ itself...”

A vast number of people are fearful of the future. For them, there is no future, they are afraid of the coming New Year. To remain in a state of fear and anxiety is to close our ears to the voice of the Christian message.

*“ Today a Saviour has been born to us. He is Christ the Lord.....
For the People who walk in the valley of deep shadow ,
a light has shone, the light to enlighten all peoples.”*

I write these few lines after returning from “ Bethlehem” and the Bells ring in 2021, HAPPY NEW YEAR.

I encountered the Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph who welcomed me and reassured me of their Continual Love and Concern for each of us, for we are FAMILY. They told me they must continue their journey into the unknown, and have asked us to join them. Yes, it's not going to be an easy journey, but we cannot stand on the threshold of the New Year and not move forward.

I sat at the entrance of the Parish Crib and wept for the past year.... of the times I failed the Lord and you., my short-sightedness, stupidity and foolishness. But Our Lady like any mother, wiped away the tears, held me in her arms , kissed me and told me I was loved, because I am precious in her eyes along with Jesus, Joseph,..... FAMILY.

That kiss, that embrace, those kind encouraging words were for all of us . Like the Angel bringing the Message of Christmas I bring you as the New Year Messenger, the Message of Hope, Love and Re-assurance.

We must be New Year Messengers and share with others:

“ I bring you news of Great Joy”

As I walked away from the Holy Family, I saw in the distance, the arrival of the Three Wise Men, bearing Gifts, not of Gold, Frankincense or Myrrh, but of Expectation, Future and Hope. I encountered a fourth Wise Man plodding along on a donkey bringing the gift of Vaccine. Remember the donkey is not a race horse, sleek and fast, but a plodder and reliable, who in time will bring the gift of healing. So, patience, my friend. It's on its way !

I wish to end with the words of the Queen's father, George VI . The World was over-run with the start of the Second World War. No hope or future , a war that brought misery and despair. So on the eve of 1940 he spoke these words trying to inspire and energise a fearful and depressed nation.

“ We shall remain undaunted in the face of war. I said to the Man who stood at the Gate of the New Year

“ Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown” and he replied

“ Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be better than light, and safer than a known way”
