WEEKLY MESSAGE

This Sunday, though it is the 17th March and would, in the normal course of events be the Feast of St Patrick, is the Fifth Sunday in Lent, which takes precedence. However, we can remember St Patrick in our prayers and we will be celebrating our own Patron Saint at a later date when it can be given full Solemnity.

Many of you will have noticed that Spring bulbs have begun to make an appearance and our grass has been cut in readiness for Palm Sunday, which is next weekend. Things are beginning to happen. Winter is on the way out and the seeds which have lain in the ground for many months are beginning to sprout.

When a seed is buried in the ground, it goes through a process like death and then transforms. Did you know that from one seed of wheat, more than twenty kernels of wheat can appear; a huge crop! Seeds often need different conditions so that they can reach their full potential. Some need to be sown in the winter months so that from deep down in the earth they can experience very cold temperatures and some need to be sown in warm, rich soil. Seeds need to be sown together all in their proper time. Once sown and cared for properly, seeds will provide a rich harvest.

Jesus teaches us that people, like seeds, need proper care. We are intended to spend life with other people, and share what we have. If we let go of our selfishness and greed, if we instead plant seeds of love, kindness, and joy, we will create a world that will grow in the love of Christ. As followers of Jesus, we must be willing to be with other people and develop our relationships in a true and meaningful way so that we can offer love and hope to the world. Jesus' analogy of the grain of wheat dying to produce abundant fruit serves as a powerful reminder that our own sacrifices and trials can lead to spiritual growth and eternal life, echoing the hope and victory of the Paschal Mystery. Lent can seem a dark and cold time; a time which is full of stillness, reflection and repentance. But as the weeks go on, the time for us to be joyful awaits us. The Lord's radiance is calling us out of the darkness and into His glorious light, where we can blossom and bloom, a hundred fold. The seeds of love and kindness planted by God in our hearts are waiting to burst forth and to be shared with others. But our seeds need to be nurtured and if we have turned away and forgotten about them, now is the time to turn back and ask the Lord to teach us how to encourage them so that everyone can experience the Love and Joy that only the Lord can bring.

Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only one seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds

God of all seasons, we give You thanks for the turning of the world, that all things become new. We see the signs of Spring: the birds returning, the buds forming, the days are growing longer. We know that while terrible things are happening in our world You are still making everything new. The trees are older than our conflicts, the migratory patterns are older than our roads. You continue to turn us again and again to something new. We give you thanks for the seasons in our lives, that the struggle and suffering that we see now will not last forever. The seasons will turn, but Your Love for us is the one constant in this universe. May we cling to your Love and nurture the seeds of Love and Kindness that you have sown in our hearts.
